

## MATH 220, Fall 2015. Writing Assignment.

### Due dates and further details.

**Note: Electronic version of all assignments must be submitted to Turnitin via E-Campus!**

**Wednesday 09/23. 2 points** Tell me what your topic is. Topics not on the suggested list must be approved by me.

If you don't choose a topic, I will choose one for you (0 points earned in this case).

**Monday 09/28. 8 points** Paper proposal (**typed**), **at least four sentences describing the chosen topic**, due at or before the start of the class.

**Friday 10/16. 15 points** Outline of paper that contains most or all the ideas that will appear in the final paper, is due at or before the start of class. (**Typed**)

**Monday 10/26. 20 points** Two typed copies of the **rough draft** of the term paper are due at or before the start of class. It must be **at least 1500 words long and typed** (approximately 6 pages or more if double spaced, graphs and pictures should be in an appendix and do not count for the length of the paper). The grade will be based on content. Note: Make sure to attach the Student Editor Worksheet (click here: [http://www.math.tamu.edu/~shatalov/StudentEditor\\_S15.pdf](http://www.math.tamu.edu/~shatalov/StudentEditor_S15.pdf)) to the top of one of the drafts (fill in your name and titles).

**Wednesday 10/28** Each enrolled student will get one term paper of another student for editing. Editors should follow the guidelines on the Student Editor Worksheet (click here: [http://www.math.tamu.edu/~shatalov/StudentEditor\\_S15.pdf](http://www.math.tamu.edu/~shatalov/StudentEditor_S15.pdf)).

**Monday 11/02. 10 points** Editorial corrections are due from students.

**Monday 12/07. 45 points** A hard copy of the final paper is due at or before the beginning of the class. It must be **at least 2000 words long and typed** (approximately 8 pages (but no more than 10 pages) if double spaced. Note that figures tables and graphs are not counted as the volume and should be contained in an appendix). The grade will be based on mathematics and presentation. **Both edited drafts and the paper outline must be turned in along with the final version of the term paper.**
