## Information for Final Exam

1. **Where/When is the final exam?** The final exam is scheduled as:

2. **Exam format:** The final exam is comprehensive and will have 27 multiple choice problems. Your best 25 will be considered at 4 points a piece for a total of 100 points. You will be allowed to use a NON GRAPHING CALCULATOR for the final exam. **Bring a scantron to the final, #882-ES.** This is the LONG skinny green scantron, not the quizzstrips.
