

MATH 300  
**Term Paper Guidelines**

Note: This is not a full term paper description.

- Special attention must be given to the notations used, so before starting your math term paper you should specify them and be consistent throughout the text. *Make sure that all of the variables that you use are described.*
- Use mathematical symbols correctly (see also [1]).
- Try to be concise and clear with definitions. Also use them through the paper.
- Make sure your writing is clear and easy to understand (no sentence fragments; punctuation is correct (including in formulas); text flows smoothly; spelling is right.)
- Use third person writing your paper.
- Label pages (except of Title Page and Table of Contents), equations, definitions, theorems, sections, subsections, figures, tables etc.
- Make sure that you have read the "Communicating Mathematics" handout and follow techniques/directions explained there. It is also recommended to use [1] and [2].
