
Section 2.7:Tangents, velocities, and other rates of change.

Consider a curve with equation y = f(x) and points P(a, f(a)) and Q(x, f(x)) on it. The slope of the secant line PQ (also known as average rate or average velocity) is



DEFINITION 1. The tangent line to the curve y = f(x) at the point P(a, f(a)) is the line through P with slope

 $m = \lim_{x \to a} \frac{f(x) - f(a)}{x - a}$ provided that this limit exists. (1)


The slope (1) of tangent line also known as instantaneous rate of change or instantaneous velocity.

(b) Find the equation of the tangent line to the graph of f(x) at x = 5. (Recall that point-slope form for a line through the point (x_1, y_1) with slope m is: $y - y_1 = m(x - x_1)$.)

DEFINITION 3. If $\mathbf{r}(t)$ is a vector function then the tangent vector \mathbf{v} at t = a is found by



$$\mathbf{v} = \lim_{t \to a} \frac{1}{t - a} [\mathbf{r}(t) - \mathbf{r}(a)].$$



EXAMPLE 4. Given curve $\mathbf{r}(t) = \langle 2t, 10t - t^2 \rangle$.

(a) Find a vector tangent to the curve at the point
$$(4,16)$$
.

Fing $a: \vec{r}(a) = \langle 2a, \log a - a^2 \rangle = \langle 4, 16 \rangle = \rangle$

$$\vec{V} = \lim_{t \to 2} \frac{1}{t-2} [\vec{r}(t) - \vec{r}(a)]$$

$$\vec{V} = \lim_{t \to 2} \frac{1}{t^{-2}} \left[(2t, (0t-t^2) - (4, 16)) \right]$$

$$\lim_{t\to 2} \frac{1}{t-2} (2t-4) = 10t-t^2-16$$

$$\begin{array}{ll} t \to 2 & t \to 2 \\ = \lim_{t \to 2} \frac{(2(t-1), -(t-8)(t-2))}{t-2} = \lim_{t \to 2} (2, 8-t) = \\ & + 12 \\ & = (2, 6) \end{array}$$

(b) Find parametric equations of the tangent line to relive to \vec{r} (2) = (4,16) The point \vec{r} (2) = (4,16)

$$-x = 4 + 2t$$

(c) Find a Edition in adjustical transfer line
$$x = y = y = 16$$

 $y = \frac{x-4}{2}$ $y = \frac{y-16}{6}$ Where $y = \frac{4}{2} = \frac{4}{6}$ $y = \frac{4}{2} = \frac{4}{6}$ $y = \frac{6}{2} = 3$ $y = \frac{4}{6}$ $y = \frac{6}{2} = 3$

$$y-y_1=m(x-x_1)$$

$$m = \frac{6}{2} = 3$$

$$|y-16=3(x-4)$$

Velocities. Denote by f(t) the position of an object at time t. The Average Velocity of the object from t = a to t = b is

$$\frac{f(b) - f(a)}{b - a}.$$

The Instantaneous Velocity of the object at time t = a is

$$v(a) = \lim_{h \to 0} \frac{f(a+h) - f(a)}{h}.$$

(Compare this formula with (1) by substitution h = x - a.)

By (1)
$$v(a) = \lim_{x \to a} \frac{f(x) - f(a)}{x - a} = \lim_{h \to a} \frac{f(x) - f(a)}{x - a}$$

$$v(a) = \lim_{h \to 0} \frac{f(a+h) - f(a)}{h}$$

$$x = h + a$$

EXAMPLE 5. The position (in meters) of an object moving in a straight path is given by

$$s(t) = t^2 - 2t + 8,$$

where t is measured in seconds.

(a) Find the average velocity over the time interval [4,5]. $aver. \ \ Velocity = \frac{5(5) - 5(4)}{5 - 4} = \frac{25 - 10 + 8 - (16 - 8 + 8)}{1} = \frac{16}{5}$

(b) Find the instantaneous velocity at time t = 4.

$$v(4) = \lim_{t \to 4} \frac{s(t) - s(4)}{t - 4} = \lim_{t \to 4} \frac{t^2 - 2t + 8 - 16}{t - 4}$$

$$v(4) = \lim_{t \to 4} \frac{t^2 - 2t - 8}{t - 4} = \lim_{t \to 4} \frac{(t + 4)(t + 2)}{t - 4} = 6 \frac{m}{s}$$

Other Rates of Change:

The Average Rate of change of function f(x) from x = a to x = b is

$$\frac{f(b)-f(a)}{b-a}.$$

The Instantaneous Rate of Change of f(x) at x = a is

$$\lim_{h\to 0} \frac{f(a+h)-f(a)}{h} = \lim_{x\to a} \frac{f(x)-f(a)}{x-a}$$
