Travel Documents

- Passport
 - Check expiration date
 - Where to get a passport
 - Urgency of getting passport
- U.S. citizenship
 - 6 months at entry and 3 months beyond departure
- · Non-U.S. citizenship
 - Check in with Texas A&M
 International Student Services
 - Double-check regulations with a local consulate/embassy

- Transfer to Bale-Mulhouse (BSL) Airport: Sunday June 23 in the morning.




Airfare


