1. [10] Give the precise definition for the derivative of a function $f(x)$ at a number $a \in \mathbb{R}$.
2. [10] Compute the following trigonometric limit. Do not use L'Hospital's rule.

$$
\lim _{\theta \rightarrow 0} \frac{1-\cos \theta}{\sin ^{2} \theta}
$$

3. Compute the derivative $y^{\prime}$ of the following functions.
(a) $[10] y=\tan \left(e^{x}+x^{2}\right)$
(b) $[10] y=\frac{x^{2} e^{x}}{\cos x^{2}}$
(c) $[10] y=\sin ^{2}(\ln x)$
(d) $[10] y=x^{x}$
4. [15] Find the velocity and acceleration of a particle with position $\mathbf{r}(t)$ given by

$$
\mathbf{r}(t):=\left\langle t^{4}-7 t^{2}, t^{2}+2 t\right\rangle
$$

Is the particle ever at rest?
5. [10] Compute $y^{\prime}$ where $y$ is a function of $x$ defined implicitly by

$$
\sqrt{x y}=2 x-\sqrt{y} .
$$

6. [15] A spherical snowball melts in such a way that its volume is decreasing at a rate of $10 \mathrm{~cm}^{3}$ per second. How fast is its diameter decreasing when the diameter is 10 cm ?

## Extra Credit

7. [optional bonus 10] Let $f(x)=x^{2} \cos \frac{1}{x}$. What is $f^{\prime}(0)$ ? Justify your answer.
